Along the Missouri River in western Iowa exists a geological masterpiece that's recognized the world over as having the finest agricultural soil, and long-revered for its tapestry of scenic spaces, artisans and rich cultural heritage.

You'll discover the beauty of the Loess Hills while visiting Hitchcock Nature Center in Honey Creek, Iowa. Get hands on experiences learning about the preservation of this fragile ecosystem, viewing the unique wildlife or exploring the 13 miles of hiking trails perfect for all abilities.

Continue to explore the Loess Hills area gourmet artisanal foods and wine, organic farms, and embrace nature in its finest setting.

Smell the fragrance of French lavender fields and sip on some lavender lemonade at the Loess Hills Lavender Farm in Missouri Valley. The farm has more than 2,000 lavender plants. Harvest your own lavender, browse the gift shop featuring an assortment of homemade bath and skin care products.

Honey Creek Creamery is a farmstead dairy that prides itself on its quality artisan cheese crafted using fresh milk from goats that are fed rich, chemical-free alfalfa and raised on the farm. You'll have a chance to interact with the goats, learn how they are milked, see how the cheese is processed, and sample some of their products.

At Sawmill Hollow Family Farm in Missouri Valley you'll be introduced to the aronia berry, a fruit that's gaining in popularity because it's packed with antioxidants and considered the ultimate superfood. America's first aronia berry farm offers wines, gourmet food, tours, scenic lake and a picturesque Loess Hills experience.

The lowana Farm in Crescent is all about teaching what it means to grow certified organic produce in the Loess Hills and what heirloom seeds are. The vegetables are all grown on their grandfather's farm.

Harrison County Historical Village and Welcome Center includes a Lincoln Highway Loess Hills Interpretive Center featuring films, a scenic overlook, one-mile trail through restored prairie, road demonstration area, and children's transportation themed play space. The five-building historical complex features an original log cabin and one-room school. The welcome center includes an Iowa-themed gift shop – all enjoyed with a free sample of cherry drink!
